

Visiting Music Teacher (Peripatetic) Job Description

Duties and Responsibilities

Accountable to the head of the relevant department (HoD), instrumental/vocal teachers are paid per session delivered and are expected to:-

- 1. Teach music lessons to assigned pupils as follows: pupils from Rec Yr2; 20 minute lessons, Yr3 6th Form; 30 minute lessons (30 lessons per full academic year).
- 2. Encourage and support pupils in developing effective practice routines.
- 3. Inspire and enthuse pupils through their teaching.
- 4. Monitor and report on pupils' progress as reasonably required by the Head of Music, including recording regular entries in each student's practice diary.
- 5. To prepare pupils for all elements of external music examinations as appropriate, organising necessary aural and theory training, in consultation with parents.
- 6. Encourage pupils to perform in concerts and to advise Head of Music the suitability of individuals for particular ensembles inside or outside school.
- 7. Coach and lead ensembles as required and requested by Head of Music, preparing the groups for concert performance as necessary.
- 8. Attend concerts if directing an ensemble/choir that is performing.
- 9. Attend normal staff meetings and Professional Learning and Development (PLD) sessions (the payment for attendance at these events is at our meeting hourly rate.)
- 10. Adhere to the ethos of the school:
 - a. Promote the agreed vision and aims of the school
 - b. Set an example of personal integrity and professionalism.
 - c. Attend appropriate staff meetings and parents' evenings.

 specialism(s) in conjunction with the Head of Music.
